## Lake Oswego Millennium Concert Band

**Jeff Binns**



Jeff originates from England and has his musical roots in the very competitive world of brass bands. After starting out playing baritone at aged 11, Jeff moved to euphonium and quickly progressed to Championship section level banding (Jaguar Cars (City of Coventry) Band) where he competed against some of the very finest brass bands in the world (such as Black Dyke, Grimethorpe and Fodens). It was during the rigorous rehearsals and preparation for the major competitions such as the National Brass Band Finals (Royal Albert Hall) and British Open Competitions that his playing quickly improved. An insight into the world of brass bands in the U.K. can be obtained by watching the film "Brassed Off".

In 1990, Jeff took a break from music to further his academic studies and completed a Ph.D degree in Physics from Imperial College, London University in 1994. Jeff then emigrated with his wife to St. Louis, Missouri to work as a Research Scientist at MEMC Electronic Materials Inc., a supplier of silicon wafers to the electronics and solar industries. In St. Louis, Jeff resumed his musical activities joining first the Mera-mac Symphonic Band and then later becoming a founding member and President of the Saint Louis Brass Band. As principal euphonium, Jeff featured prominently as a soloist in concerts and also on their CD entitled "Strike Up the Band". The St. Louis Brass Band competed in the North American Brass Band Association (NABBA) competitions every year from 1999-2005 and achieved a ranking in the top 100 best brass bands in the world in 2003. Jeff also competed in the individual NABBA solo championships and achieved a top three placing on three separate occasions.

In 2006, Jeff moved to Boise, Idaho to work in the Wafer Characterization Department at Micron Technology, Inc. Jeff rejoined MEMC Electronic Materials (now Sun-Edison, Inc.) in 2011 and moved to their Portland, Oregon plant where they manufacture high purity silicon for the solar industry. He lives with his wife, Linda in Gresham. Jeff is now proud to play euphonium in the Lake Oswego Millennium Concert Band under the Directorship of Dale Cleland. This is Jeff's fourth time to perform as soloist with LOMCB.

### Tonight's Artists

**Hans Ogren** is a local Oregonian, musician, and photographer. He has played with the Millennium Band for the past 5 years (on Tuba, Percussion, and currently French Horn), and teaches music in public schools and private lessons. Besides music, Hans also enjoys hiking around the Pacific Northwest and photographing its natural beauty. Over the past two years, his hobby of photography began to become a business, photographing portraits, weddings, real estate, etc. Hans continues to take photos of nature and landscapes for his own enjoyment, and has displayed some of his nature and landscape photos in the lobby. Hans has also recently had 3 photos chosen by the Arts Council of Lake Oswego to be displayed in their May Exhibition, "Capturing Place". This exhibit will be open to the public from May 4<sup>th</sup> to June 15<sup>th</sup> at the Art Council's Gallery, located at 520 First Street in Lake Oswego.

**Kathy Sengenberger** has been weaving since the early '90's, starting on a small 4 harness table loom made by her father. She takes great pleasure in mixing and matching fibers, colors, and textures. Each piece is unique. Her unlined jackets are roomy and long with kimono-style sleeves. The jackets are usually woven of rayon, cotton, silk, tencel and/or bamboo-whatever inspires her at the time. Depending on the colors and fibers, they can be worn any time of the year. Kathy also loves to weave ponchos, scarves, stoles and capes-all one of a kind. Weaving is Kathy's passion and she is at her loom nearly every day.

**Debbie Grant's** ceramics are all hand made, from casting the piece, to drawing the designs, painting, firing the colors in and then going through the glazing process. The work is whimsical yet very functional and comes "alive" as Debbie draws and paints. They are lead free, microwave, oven and dishwasher safe. Seasonal pieces are always fun to make and she loves working with customers to make something specifically for them. Debbie says, "When people look at my work and smile, it makes me smile also."
