ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Diane Chaplin is a world-class cellist and dedicated music educator, and enjoys a career as a soloist and chamber musician. Before moving to Portland in 2009, Diane spent 21 years as the cellist of the Colorado Quartet, enjoying an international career which took her around the globe. The Colorado Quartet was the first all-female string quartet to perform the complete Beethoven Quartet cycle in both North America and Europe and their critically-acclaimed recordings of these quartets are available on the Parnassus label. Other award-winning discs can be heard on the Parnassus, Mode and Albany labels.

Diane has held teaching positions at many prestigious institutions of higher learning: she was a visiting faculty member at Yale University, and has also taught at Bard College Conservatory, Oberlin College-Conservatory and Swarthmore College. She has given master classes at the Eastman School of Music, Northwestern University, Indiana University, Cleveland Institute of Music, Cincinnati Conservatory, Stanford University and the Banff Centre, as well as in The Netherlands, Mexico, Bosnia and Russia.

Diane holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from the California Institute of the Arts, where she was a student of Cesare Pascarella, and a Master of Music degree from The Juilliard School, where she studied with Harvey Shapiro. She received a Special Prize from the International Cello Competition in Viña del Mar, Chile, and a Certificate from the International Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow, and has appeared in concerts throughout North America and Europe.

In addition to her many solo and chamber music appearances, Diane is a member of the Portland Cello Project and performs with them around the U.S. She is also devoted to contemporary music performance and is solo cellist and co-director of Northwest New Music, a small ensemble that pairs cutting edge avant garde music with classics from the 20th century. Diane is director and conductor of the Oregon Pro Arte Youth Chamber Orchestra and Pro Arte Conservatory Strings, co-director of the Chamber Music Camp of Portland, where she conducts the advanced orchestra, and director

of PDX Chamber Music Workshops; she also has a large class of private cello students.

Donald Appert has been Music Director/Conductor of the Clark College Orchestra since 1990. He has quest conducted orchestras in Europe, Central America, Japan and Australia. In March he was the guest conductor for the Filharmonica "Mihail Jora" Bacau (Romania) performing his Concertino for Bass Clarinet and String Orchestra with Rocco Parisi of Italy as soloist. Currently he is a Professor of Music and Head of the Music Department at Clark College in Vancouver. He is in his second season as Artistic Director and Conductor of the Jewish Community Orchestra. In addition he is the Music Director/Conductor of the Oregon Sinfonietta in Portland, and also the Sanctuary Choir Director for the First United Methodist Church of Vancouver. He received The American Prize in Orchestral Programming-Vytautas Marijosius Memorial Award in 2011 for his work with the Oregon Sinfonietta and an Honorable Mention for the same award in 2012. In 2009 he received the Washington Community College Humanities Association Exemplary Status Award. His work as a composer has been recognized by six ASCAPLUS Awards. 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
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
