#### **ABOUT THE ARTISTS**

Brett Deubner, one of this generation's most accomplished violists, has inspired worldwide critical acclaim for his powerful intensity and sumptuous tone. Recent performances include concerto appearances with the Grand Rapids Symphony, the Thuringer Symphoniker in Saalfed, Germany, New Jersey Symphony Orchestra, the Knoxville Symphony, the Grainger Wind Symphony in Melbourne, the Filharmonic del Quito, String Orchestra of the Rockies, the National Symphony of Ecuador, the State Orchestra of Merida, Venezuela, the New Symphony of Sofia, Bulgaria, the Peninsula Symphony of California and the Kiev Camerata in Ukraine.

The 2013-14 season highlights include debuts with the Missoula Symphony, The Texas Festival Orchestra at Round Top, the Lyviv Festival Orchestra in Ukraine, the Orquestra Filarmonica do Espirito Santo in Brazil and Orchestre Bel'Arte in Paris. He has collaborated with some of today's leading conductors such as Ann Manson, Lucas Richman, David Lockington, Patricio Aizaga and Rossen Milanov.

Brett Deubner's commitment to extending the repertoire for the viola is made evident by collaborations with some of today's greatest composers such as Samuel Adler, Lalo Schifrin, Andrew Rudin, David Del Tredici and several of this generation's leading young composers. To date, over 80 works for viola including 27 viola concerti and numerous solo and chamber works for viola have been dedicated to and premiered by Brett Deubner.

Brett Deubner has served on the faculty of Temple University's Boyer School of Music and Dance in Philadelphia and Kean University's Conservatory of Music. Constantly in demand as a master class visiting guest and chamber music collaborator, Brett Deubner is on the faculty of the International Festival at Round Top, and the Musica Negli Horti festival in Tuscany, Italy. Brett is the Artistic Director of the concert series, "Music and More" in New Jersey where he makes his home with his wife and four children.

Acclaimed as a composer of "truly beautiful" and "hauntingly moving" music, Philadelphia native Amanda Harberg engages audiences and performers alike on both emotional and intellectual levels. Harberg's (cont.)

upcoming commissions include orchestral works for the Grand Rapids Symphony and the New Jersey Youth Symphony, a concerto for cello, electronics and chamber orchestra for cellist David Eggar and the St. Petersburg Chamber Philharmonic, and Feathers and Wax, for flutist Julietta Curenton's debut with the Philadelphia Chamber Music Society. Recent performances include Venus Unhinged, commissioned by the Albany Symphony and David Alan Miller, Of Earth and Air, commissioned by the University of Nevada Reno Symphony Orchestra, and Concerto for Viola and Orchestra, commissioned by violist Brett Deubner. Her works have been played by ensembles including the Grand Rapids Symphony, the National Symphony of Ecuador, the American Composers Orchestra, the American Modern Ensemble, the Olympia Philharmonic Society, the Thuringer Symphoniker, the New Jersey Youth Symphony, the Pasadena Youth Symphony, the FAUST Youth Symphony, the Harmonium Choral Society and many more.

Harberg's awards include a Fulbright/Hays Fellowship to study with Frederic Rzewski in Belgium, two Meet the Composer Creative Connections grants, the New York Youth Symphony's First Music Award, the Juilliard School's Peter Menin Prize, a MacDowell Colony summer residency, Springside Chestnut Hill Academy's Outstanding Young Alumna Award, and grants from foundations including the Mellon Foundation, the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation, the New York State Council on the Arts, a Live Music for Dance grant, and the New York State Music Teachers Association. As in House composer for Common Good Productions, Harberg has also composed music for an award winning feature documentary as well as documentaries on PBS and for the Teaching Channel.

Harberg has recordings out on Koch International, Albany Records, Centaur Records, Walking Frog Records and upcoming recordings on American Modern Ensemble Records. Her educational band and piano music is published by C.L. Barnhouse and by Createspace. She has taught at Juilliard, Interlochen, the Luzerne Music Center and the University of Nevada Reno Symphony Orchestra, and Concerto for Viola and Orchestra, commissioned by violist Brett Deubner. Her works have been played by ensembles including the Grand Rapids Symphony, the National Symphony of Ecuador, the American Composers Orchestra, the American Modern Ensemble, the Olympia Philharmonic Society, the Thuringer Symphoniker, the New Jersey Youth Symphony, the Pasadena Youth Symphony, the FAUST Youth Symphony, the Harmonium Choral Society and many more.






