

Notes

Steal Away (to Jesus) is a spiritual composed in the mid-1800s, and served as a code song for the Underground Railroad.

The Power And The Glory is a suite of four jazz-inspired pieces by composer, professor, and trombonist David Uber.

Pink Panther is the theme tune for the 1963 film of the same name, and later for many of the Inspector Clouseau films and an animated series.

A **Charivari** refers to a 'tumult' or a rustic character piece from the French Baroque tradition. Hold onto your seats as Solid Brass' own Doug Harris blazes his way through this whirlwind piece.

(The Bonnie Banks o') **Loch Lomond** is a traditional Scottish song written in 1841 by an unknown composer. The meaning of the song is generally connected to the soul of an executed soldier traveling back to his homeland via the "low road," while his living comrade walks back along the "high road."

Holiday for Trumpets is based on the theme song of *The Red Skelton Show*, "Holiday for Strings." This rendition features three of our trumpeters.

Blackbird is a popular Beatles tune inspired by racial tensions in the late 1960s, and reimagined here with funk and samba beats.

Go the Distance comes from Disney's 1997 animated film, *Hercules*, in which Hercules prays to the gods to help him find where he belongs.

Africa was released by the American band Toto in 1981, topped the Billboard charts, and has seen a recent resurgence in popularity.

Doug Harris is currently the Director of Bands at Clark College in Vancouver, WA. Prior to this, he held similar positions at Western Kentucky University, Santa Clara University, and the University of Southern Utah, all of which was proceeded by a long career as a high school band director in Florida. He completed his undergraduate education at the University of Florida and both his Masters and Doctoral degrees (Wind Conducting and Trumpet Performance/Pedagogy) at the University of Northern Colorado. He has held principal trumpet positions in the Cambrian Symphony, Palo Alto Chamber Orchestra, Orchestra of Southern Utah, Treasure Coast Symphony, Mission Peak Brass Band (Eb Cornet), and the Symphonic Band of the Palm Beaches. His main trumpet teachers have been Joanne Epstein, R. Gary Langford (UF), and Professor William Pfund.
